



PROJECT: THE CAPITAL GRILLE WALL STREET

Project Description: Remco restores and refinishes the metal work both on the exterior and throughout the interior of the restaurant.

Building: The Capital Grille in Manhattan's Financial District opened to the public on September 28, 2009. The restaurant, which joins The Capital Grille Chrysler Center and Time-Life Building, is New York City's newest location. The Capital Grille Wall Street is architecturally unique, located on three levels in an historic bank building, complete with an enormous, original vault on the ground level incorporated into the design scheme. Darden Restaurants, Inc., (NYSE: DRI) headquartered in Orlando, Fla., is the world's largest company-owned and operated restaurant company with over \$7 billion in annual sales and through subsidiaries, the company employs approximately 180,000 employees.
